



**General Overview of Collage:**

Children will have the opportunity to explore creating a variety of images on different backgrounds with a variety of media for example using paper, magazines, fabric and more. Children experiment with sorting and arranging materials and refining their work based on the theme of fairytales.



**What is collage?**

A piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.

**Art Objectives:**

- To use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
- To use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
- To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.
- To discuss the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

**What materials can be used for collage?**

Natural materials – leaves, twigs, petals.

Coloured paper and tissue paper

Fabric

Wrapping paper

Newspaper or magazine cut outs

Buttons/ small objects/recycled materials

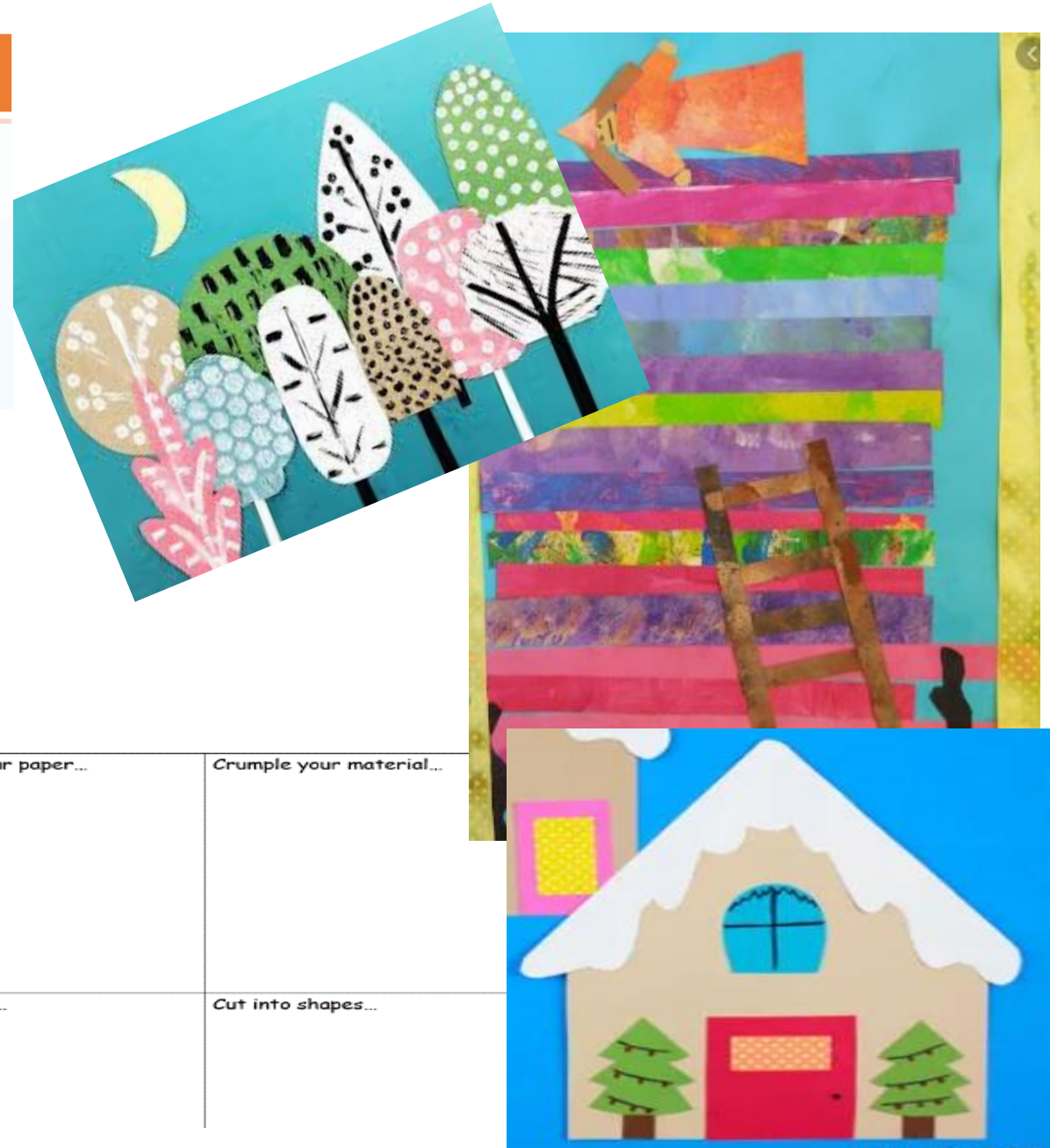
## Who is Henri Matisse?

# Who Was Henri Matisse?

Henri Matisse was a French artist known for his use of colour and shape. When he was young, he did lots of paintings but as he grew older he began to make striking collages, which are pictures made by using cut out bits of paper.



We will study the work of Henri Matisse, find about his influential artwork in painting and collage and focus on this collage piece titled, 'The snail'. Children will then develop their own opinions and thoughts and work to recreate this piece.
