Key Vocabulary	Definition
Rhythm	A pattern of long and short notes in a song.

Vocabulary I will learn...

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Melody	A combination of pitch and rhythm.
Ostinato	A repeated pattern or melody in a piece of music.
Tempo	The speed of the music, tempo can change between fast and slow.
Pitch	Whether the singer/piece of music uses high or low notes.
Reggae	A musical genre originated in Jamaica.
Pulse	The steady beat of the song which can be heard when you listen to a song.



Reggae is a style of music that started in Jamaica in the late 1960s.

The use of the rhythm guitar makes it unique and has helped it to cut through to a dance music genre.

Bob Marley is a famous reggae artist. He was a world ambassador and has many well known songs, one which is, Jamming.




This is a **C** note
