










Here are some possible activities to try with your child that will link to their learning at school.

Autumn	Spring	Summer
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sharing stories and rhymes together • Count/stamp/clap/tap syllables in words • Explore mark making with pencils, pens, chalks • Counting toys/steps/things when you are out and about • Exploring different quantities thinking about who has more/who has less • Build muscle through large movements e.g. climbing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Follow simple instructions • Share stories and sing rhymes missing words allowing your child to jump in • Model drawing meaningful pictures • Explore making marks to represent numbers e.g. drawing 3 circles 2 lines 4 dots • Use different one handed tools- paintbrushes, scissors, glue sticks, spade • When reading make note of the front cover, back cover and pages in between 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Share known books with your child allowing them to retell the story/Use toys to retell known stories • Explore initial sounds in words e.g. a a a apple ssssssnake • Practise copying letters in name • Count objects and match to numbers • Letter and number formation • Counting a range of toys/objects to 10
