Eid al-Fitr is an Islamic holiday and is a special celebration at the end of Ramadan.

Eid al-Fitr means 'The Festival of Breaking of the Fast'.

Fasting during Ramadan means that Muslim people do not eat between sunrise and sunset.

Guru Nanak was the first Sikh Guru, he came from a small town called Talwandi in India 500 years ago.

Nanak often told stories of God to gathering crowds in the village, where he was called a 'Guru'.

When he was 30, Nanak disappeared, leaving all but his clothes. Some thought he died. A few days later, he returned and said he had been with God. He travelled across India teaching God's message.

Sikhs read the holy book, the Guru Granth Sahib, continuously

Banners are put up at the gurdwara to show the celebration

Gurdwaras (holy temple) are decorated with flowers and lights

Sikhs dress in smart or new clothes for special services

Sometimes, firework displays are arranged

A street procession of the Guru Granth Sahib is held
