## What is Sculpture?

Sculpture is the art of molding and shaping a material into an object. Sculptures can be Abstract or Representational.

## Who is Guiseppe Arcimboldo?

- Born in Milan, Italy in 1527.
- Began his career as a traditional painter of religious subjects in Italy and for royalty in Austria and Germany.
- His most famous works, however, are the heads which he composed out of fruit, vegetables, fish and roots. See example above.
