

What is Sculpture?

Sculpture is the art of molding and shaping a material into an object.

Sculptures can be **Abstract** or **Representational**.



Key Vocabulary & Definitions		
Abstract	When something doesn't look like a familiar picture or object.	
Representational	When a sculpture looks like a familiar thing such as a flower.	
Clay	Moldable material	
3D	3-dimensional- a solid shape that has depth, length and width.	
Geometric	Using known shapes to create a sculpture.	
Statue/sculpture	The art of making something using molding or carving.

Who is Guiseppe Arcimboldo?

- Born in Milan, Italy in 1527.
- Began his career as a traditional painter of religious subjects in Italy and for royalty in Austria and Germany.
- His most famous works, however, are the heads which he composed out of fruit, vegetables, fish and roots. See example above.
 - · Died in Milan in 1593.
