
The Jewish holy book is called the 'Torah'.



beitzah – a roasted, hardboiled egg that represents sacrifice, but also new life

karpas – a fresh green vegetable, often parsley, that symbolizes the freshness of spring, often dipped in salt water. The salt water represents the sweat and tears of the slaves in Egypt.

maror and chazeret two types of bitter herbs



zeroa – a roasted lamb or chicken bone to symbolize offerings made to God

apples, nuts, ginger,
cinnamon, and
wine, that symbolize
the mortar used by
the Israelites when
they were forced to
make bricks
