The Jewish holy book is called the 'Torah'.



beitzah – a roasted, hard-boiled egg that represents sacrifice, but also new life

zeroa – a roasted lamb or chicken bone to symbolize offerings made to God

karpas – a fresh green vegetable, often parsley, that symbolizes the freshness of spring, often dipped in salt water. The salt water represents the sweat and tears of the slaves in Egypt.

charoset – a mixture of ground apples, nuts, ginger, cinnamon, and wine, that symbolize the mortar used by the Israelites when they were forced to make bricks

maror and chazeret - two types of bitter herbs
