



## Using Mod Roc

To sculpt using mod roc bandages, you need the bandages and plenty of water in a bowl. Soak the bandages in a bowl until they are wet, then layer over your model. Use a paintbrush to poke the bandage into all of the little cracks and creases

#### Using Papier Mâché

To sculpt using papier mâché, you need PVA glue mixed with water, and a soft paper-like material. You can use either newspaper, tissue or normal paper the thinner the better! Then use a paintbrush to glue it on. The more layers you have the stronger it will be.

#### Materials

Mod Roc

A dry bandage that has Plaster of Paris in it. When wet, it can be sculpted and will dry in the shape you have created.

Plaster of Paris

A dust-like material similar to concrete that makes a material hard when it is used.


Papier Mâché

Mixing paper and glue to create a hard surface for sculpting.

# Sketch your creature



What **shapes** can you see? Finding the shapes you need will help you to transform your 2D drawing into a **3D** model.

# Shape your materials



**Shape** your **materials** by **fold**ing and scrunching your materials. Once you have created your **form**, you can **bind** your materials together.

#### Vocabulary

	January 1980
Sculpting	To create a thing, person, idea, animal out of a material such as wood, clay, plastic, etc.
Materials	An item such as wood, plastic, newspaper, paper, card, clay, string
Bind	Using a material to hold other things together
Stick	To attach one thing to another
Fold	Pinching the edge of paper or card to change the shape
Form	The shape and structure of a model (how long it is, how it fills the space)
Shape	A flat area surrounded by edges or an outline
3D	A solid object instead of something flat. It has height, length and width.

# Bind your materials

Use something to hold your **form**. You could use cling-film or tape to **stick** those pieces together.

### Paint your sculpture



Now you have finished **sculpting**, it's time to make it look even more **3D** by adding colour. Paint it in the colours you have used in your sketchbooks.



Sculpt your **3D** model out of mod roc or papier mâché. Look on the other side for lots of tips on how to do this!

Check how strong it is too.
