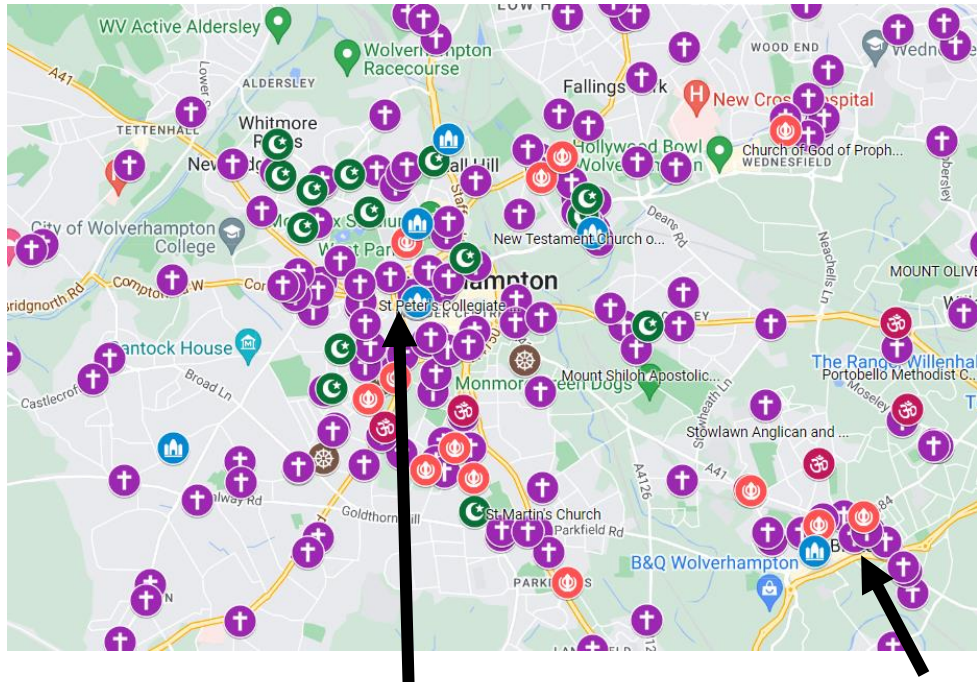




Wolverhampton's Religious Communities Faith Map

place of worship	A building or a space where a person, or group of people, worship.
religious symbol	An image that represents a religion.
harmonious	People getting along with each other.
fair trade	A way of buying and selling products, ensuring producers are paid a fair price.

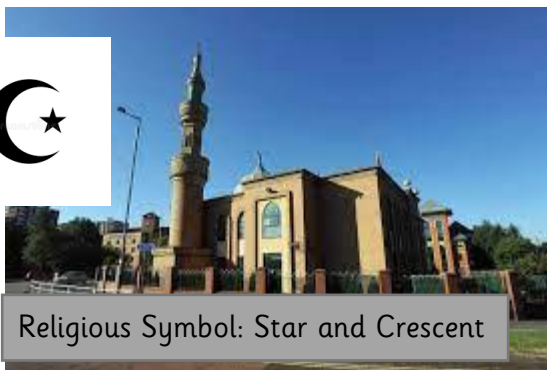

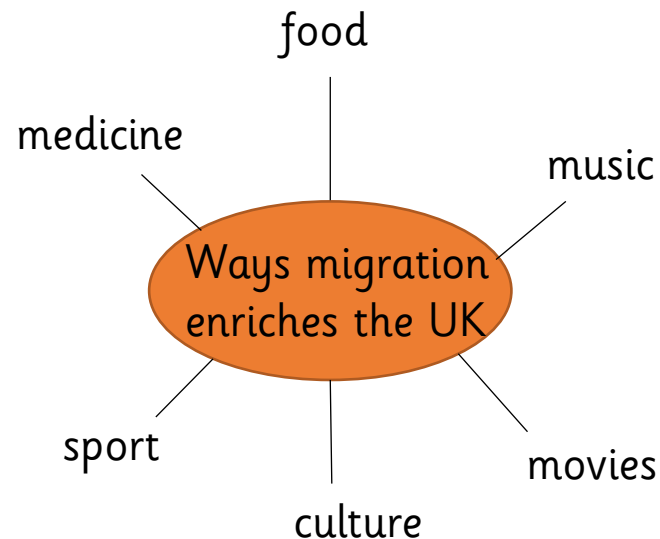
