Key Vocabulary

Presentation	A speech or talk in where a new product, idea or piece of work is shown and explained to an audience.
Search Engine	A program that searches for and identifies items in a database that link to keywords. Used for finding sites on the World Wide Web.
Evaluation	Judging something. In this case, making a judgement based on how reliable and trustworthy a website is.
eSafety	Staying safe online by using a variety of tips and tricks. For example, reporting a bad website to someone trustworthy.
Software	The programs used by a computer e.g. using Word or Spotify
Network	Interacting with other to exchange information, usually through internet
Data	Factual information and statistics
Apps	Applications are also known as programs. Apps are made by program developers and are used for lots of different reasons. You can get these from the App Store or Play Store

Keynote App

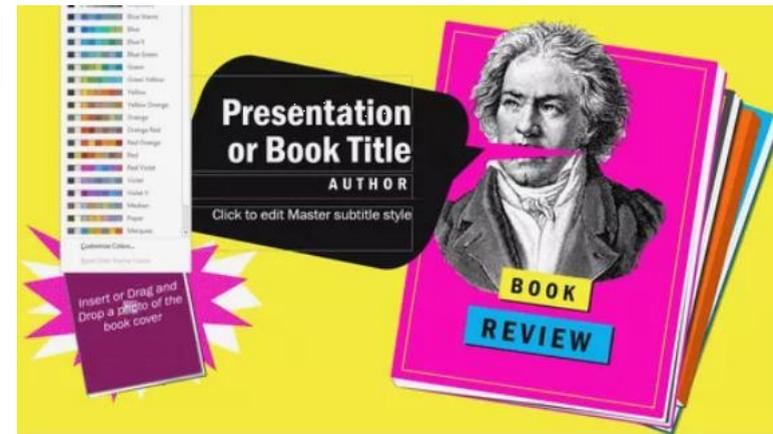
With a range of tools to use, you can create presentations with diagrams and illustrations



How to search...

When searching for something online using a search engine, use key words. For example, if you want to know about what the Romans invented, use words like Roman and inventions. Don't just search '**Romans**' because you'll get lots of unwanted results!

You can also use the minus - symbol to help you. For example by searching '**Romans -calendar**' you will avoid any searches about Julius Caesars calendar invention!



5 Tips for Perfect Presenting

Do your research! By researching properly, you will know what you are talking about.

Use pictures! By adding pictures, you are giving your audience something to look at.

Make it colourful! What is the first thing you look at on this page? It's the colour. By adding lots of colours and effects, you are showing your digital presenter skills.

Use words you know! If you aren't sure what the words mean, you shouldn't be using them. Chances are your audience doesn't know what it means either.

Speak loudly and confidently! Aren't the audience listening, or can't they hear you? By talking loudly you are capturing their attention.
