

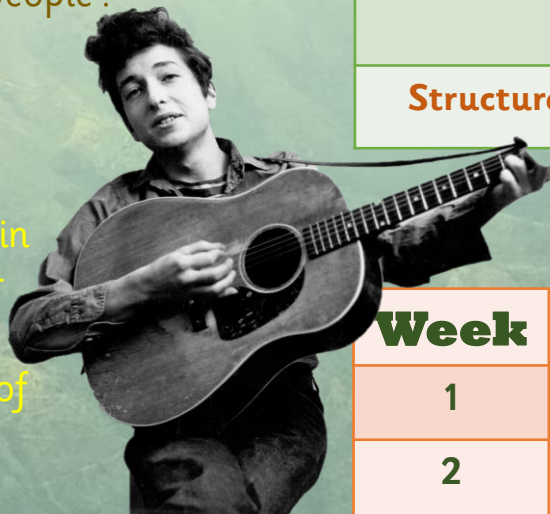


folk music



Folk music is a term used to describe all sorts of musical, oral and cultural traditions from specific regions and societies around the world. Folk comes from the German word 'volk' meaning 'the people' and folk music is often thought of as being the music belonging to 'the people'.

Bob Dylan is an American singer-songwriter. Often named as one of the greatest songwriters of all time, Dylan has been a major figure in pop-culture during a career for over more than 60 years. Many of his songs adapted the tunes and words of older folk songs.
