

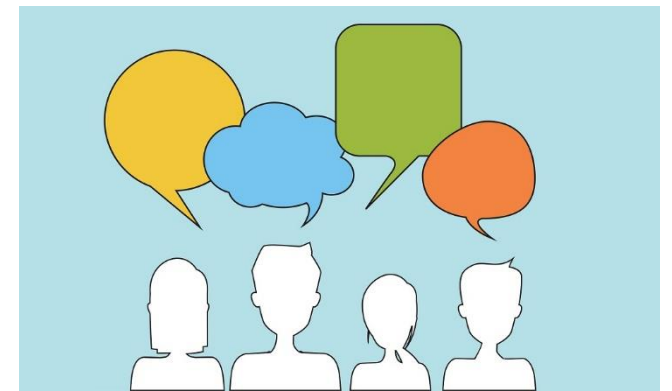
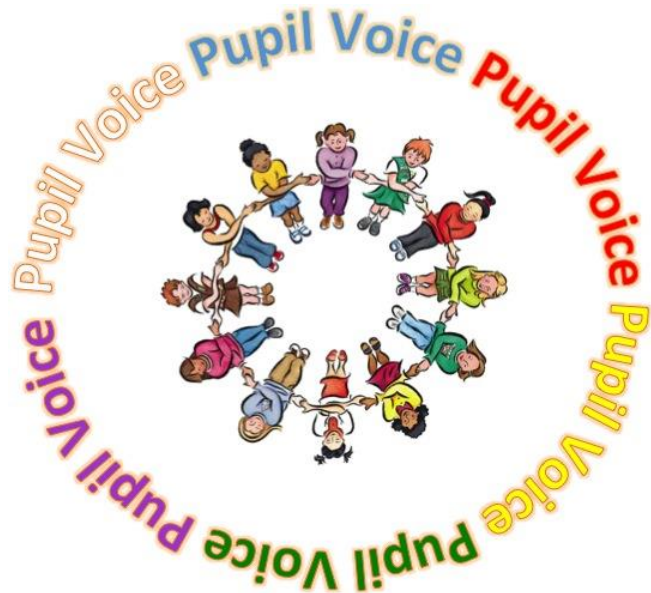


Pupil Leadership Team



What is a Pupil Leadership Team?

- ❖ A team of pupils that work together to represent the views of the other pupils across school.
- ❖ They ensure that pupils' opinions are listened to and acted upon – giving all children a voice.
- ❖ Help the headteacher, staff and governors to improve school and make it even more successful.



Our Aims

- ❖ To make our school an even better place.
- ❖ To give all children a voice by representing the views of the other pupils across school.

- ❖ To support our teachers, headteacher and governors to improve the school.



What we do

- ❖ Attend meetings to discuss issues and ideas.

- ❖ Work with adults to improve aspects of school.

How we were chosen to be representatives

All children in school were given the opportunity to nominate themselves to be the Pupil Leadership Team representative for their class.

We thought about why we would be the most appropriate candidate, presented these ideas to the children in our class and then we had an election.

Everybody had a vote and we used a polling station to make sure that it was fair.

The votes were then counted and the representatives announced.
